EN ONU EXPOSICIÓN SOBRE GAZA :

CRISIS DE HUMANIDAD, CLAMOR DE JUSTICIA

En el marco de la conmemoración del Día Internacional de Solidaridad con el Pueblo Palestino, el Comité de Naciones Unidas para el Ejercicio de los Derechos Inalienables del Pueblo Palestino y la Misión del Estado de Palestina, inauguraron en Naciones Unidas la Exposición Fotográfica sobre Gaza, Palestina: Crisis de Humanidad, Clamor de Justicia.

Las fotografías expuestas por fotoperiodistas palestinos ofrecen una visión única de las terribles condiciones de Gaza, reflejando impactantes imágenes e historias que documentan un año marcado por una de las peores tragedias de nuestro siglo, así como la resistencia ferviente de un pueblo entero, instando a la conciencia de la comunidad mundial, al recuerdo y a la acción.

El compañero Hermida resaltó que, en los últimos 14 meses, el pueblo palestino ha sufrido una violencia desproporcionada que ha causado más de 44,000 muertos y más de 104,000 heridos, desplazamientos masivos y un sufrimiento inimaginable agravado por las restricciones al acceso humanitario a productos esenciales como medicinas, alimentos y agua.

Señaló que, esta exposición nos recuerda no sólo el sufrimiento de los palestinos, sino también su inquebrantable esperanza de libertad, dignidad y paz; la urgente necesidad de una acción internacional para lograr un cese el fuego inmediato y avanzar hacia una resolución justa de la cuestión palestina.

Afirmó también que, juntos, debemos garantizar la realización de los derechos inalienables del Pueblo Palestino, el establecimiento de la paz y la dignidad en su patria.

A esta impactante exposición atendieron numerosas delegaciones de Estados miembros de ONU, demostrando su solidaridad y apoyo con el valiente pueblo Palestino, ante una oleada de ataques indiscriminados, violencia, privación de derechos y la injusticia impuesta por las crueles agresiones de Israel en el territorio palestino ocupado.

The dramatic developments of this past year in Gaza and the end of the Occupied Palestinian Territory, including East Jerusalem, come within the context of more than 17 years of Israel's occupation that the International Court of Justice (ICJ) has declared to be unlawful and that years of the Nakba, the historic displacement and dispossession of the Palestinian people, to return, to self-determination, to an independent and sovereign State of Palestine, including Jerusalem as its capital, in accordance with the relevant Security Council and General Assembly resolutions and the two-State solution on the basis of the pre-1967 borders and a life of freedom, peace, security and dignity to which all peoples are entitled.

This collective photo essay presents a small glimpse into this profoundly tragic reality and captured since October 2023 by numerous Palestinian male and female photographers from Gaza and their reflections of the moments these photographic were taken. Their personal worried that will forever stain our collective conscience, crying out for justice and for humanity.

Since its establishment, the United Nations Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People has worked tirelessly to raise awareness of the plight of the Palestinian people and to promote a just and lasting solution to the Question of Palestine in all its aspects in accordance with international law and the relevant UN resolutions. In this time of grave crisis, the Committee reaffirms its full solidarity with the Palestinian people and its unwavering commitment to achieving that just solution that will enable them to realize justice, their inalienable rights and freedom in their State of Palestine, with East Jerusalem as its capital.
